# **Campsite Furnishings**

☐ <b>Picnic Tables</b> – Inspect for structural damage or wear; tighten bolts and replace damaged boards.
☐ <b>Benches</b> – Check for loose hardware, cracks, or bent frames; clean and repaint if needed.
$\hfill \Box$ <b>Bike Racks</b> – Ensure securely anchored to the ground; inspect for rust and repaint if necessary.
☐ <b>Lantern Holders</b> – Confirm stability and that ADA-accessible models meet clear height and spacing standards.

## **Cooking Areas**

$\hfill\Box$ Fire Rings – Inspect for cracks, rust, or missing grates; replace if bent or broken.
$\hfill \Box$ <b>Adjustable Fire Rings</b> – Confirm grates move smoothly; lubricate or repair pivot points as needed.
☐ <b>Grills</b> – Check for grate functionality and surface rust; ensure posts are stable and properly mounted. Scrape off any surface rust or loose flakes with a wire brush.

## ✓ If possible, keep a small inventory on hand:

Keeping a few extra grills or fire rings on hand will allow you to conveniently replace items during the season should they become damaged. This will allow you to keep sites open instead of having to close them due to lack of site furnishings.

□ <b>Bear-Proof Food Lockers</b> – Check door seals, latches, and signage; confirm they close and lock securely.
☐ <b>Trash Receptacles</b> – Inspect for dents, missing doors, or latch issues; empty and clean liners.
$\square$ <b>Animal-Resistant Trash Containers</b> – Ensure locks and closures are functional to prevent wildlife access.
